

I am delighted to appreciate the Enrollment Team for their enthusiasm and commitment and wish them the best of luck in their future endeavors.



A Story: Colleagues and Best Friends

The person with a real friend, with whom all the things can be shared, are the luckiest in the world.

Mohammad Omar Kamal and Mansour Ibrahim are an example of such friendships. They are currently colleagues at the Office of University Communications and helping the University increase its brand awareness and reflect its achievements. "Mansour and I met for the first time at Jahan TV, where I worked as a presenter, and he was our motion graphic designer.

We established our friendship there and were cooperating with each other a lot. Then we both quit our jobs at Jahan TV, and only after two months we were able to work together again at Karwan University," said Omar. Mansour was very happy after finding that Omar has applied for a position at Karwan University, although he was not aware that Mansour is already working there.

"After quiting my job at Jahan TV, I started working with the Karwan University. One day, I saw that our Marketing Director, Mr. Shahnan is interviewing Omar for the Events and Social Media Manager position. I was more than happy and convinced him to join our team. He was accepted after the interview, and we were working together again in one place," said Mansour.



After six months, Omar decides to join Kardan University as a Communications Specialist and quit his job at Karwan University. He says, "It was not a difficult choice for me to join Kardan University, but since I could not work again with Mansour, it made me sad for some time. Omar was very young when he joined Kardan University in July 2017. His work also inspired his teammates at the University's Advancement Team. Behind the Scene

Top 3 Health Disadvantages of Using Mobile Phones for long hours



1 Brain Cancer

Mobile phones emit radiofrequency energy, a form of non-ionizing electromagnetic radiation, which can be absorbed by tissues close to the phone. The amount of radiofrequency energy a mobile phone user is exposed to depends on many factors such as the technology of the phone, the distance between the phone and the User, the extent and type of mobile phone use, and the User's distance from cell phone towers. Scientists have reported adverse health effects of using mobile phones, including changes in brain activity, reaction times, and sleep patterns.

By now, it is well known that cell phones give off radiation. This radiation affects our brain cells directly, often mutating existing cells into cancerous cells, hence, causing brain cancer. Children have the potential to be at greater risk than adults for developing brain cancer from cell phones. Their nervous systems are still developing and therefore more vulnerable to factors that may cause cancer

2 Increases stress level

Cell phones cause stress in many ways and many forms. When one gets used to a cell phone, they also become slowly dependent on it. It becomes challenging, then, to be apart from it for any time. We start fidgeting and worrying when our cell phones start losing battery. Moreover, new research shows how people get anxious when they can't answer calls or reply to texts once they see their mobile phone's screen light up, even if they are in a meeting or a lecture.

3 Dedication to work

Whenever we sit down to work, the luring applications on our mobile phones like WhatsApp, Facebook, Instagram, etc., distract our minds. We think checking the applications won't take more than 10 minutes, whereas it takes away a lot of time. And this leaves you with less amount of time for your work.
